



Ways to Help Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia

Thank you for your interest in Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia! Reach Out and Read, started in 1989, is a national, nonprofit organization that promotes early literacy and language development at 6,200 primary care health centers in our nation, with a special emphasis on children growing up in low-income communities. **In the exam rooms during well visits, primary care physicians and nurse practitioners incorporate Reach Out and Read's evidence-based model by advising parents about the importance of reading aloud and language development and giving brand-new, developmentally and culturally appropriate books to children ages 6 months through 5 years.**

Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia, established in 2002, currently includes 77 primary care health centers and 6 developmental follow-up programs in Southeastern Pennsylvania reaching approximately 75,000 young children in need. **This year Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia pediatricians, family physicians, physician assistants and nurse practitioners will need to provide at least 158,000 brand-new books to these young children (ages 6 months through 5 years).**

Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia solely relies on donations and support from schools, community groups, corporations, families, and individuals to maintain this valuable program, through fundraisers and book drives. Below are some ways to help (www.rorgp.org):

Fundraisers

Have a fundraiser to collect funds so the Reach Out and Read coordinator can purchase wonderful, appropriate books for children ages 6 months through 5 years at a 50 to 60 percent discount. It costs approximately \$27.50 to provide the new books for one child in this program, through each of the child's ten well visits from 6 months through 5 years of age. Donors in the past have had success encouraging families, groups or individuals to sponsor a child by donating Reach Out and Read costs for a child.

Book Drives

This is a great way for individuals, community organizations and children to involve themselves in helping others, and book drives are fun to do. **Please read attached guidelines and recommended titles.**

Reach Out and Read Volunteers

Adult reading volunteers (over 18 y.o.) are based in some of the primary care health center's waiting room and read aloud to children of all ages, showing parents the techniques and pleasures of looking at books. Clerical volunteers screen and pack books and help with other administrative projects. Donating Books to Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia

The Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia sites (primary care health centers) are located in Southeastern Pennsylvania -- in the cities of Abington, Broomall, Chester, Coatesville, Dresher, Drexel Hill, Kennett Square, Media, Norristown, Philadelphia, Pottstown, Souderton, Southampton, Springfield, Upland, Upper Darby and West Chester.

The staff and families at these primary care doctor/nurse practitioner offices greatly appreciate donations of wonderful children's books. Below are guidelines that were developed out of respect for families and in keeping with the philosophy of Reach Out and Read -- every child deserves good quality books.

NEW BOOKS

- In order for the primary care doctors and nurse practitioners to do the Reach Out and Read intervention and give books in the exam room during well visits (checkups), **we need at least 158,000 brand-new, developmentally and culturally appropriate books for children ages 6 months through 5 years every year.** If you choose to purchase or collect new books, attached is a short recommended title list. Reach Out and Read will accept similar new books that are not on the list.
- **We are always in great need of brand-new board books for infants and toddlers (6, 9, 12, 15, 18, 24 and 30 months old). The Reach Out and Read site coordinator can purchase the books the site needs at a 50 to 60 percent discount, so we greatly appreciate monetary donations.**

GENTLY USED BOOKS

- Most Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia sites can accept donations of gently used children's books so the healthcare staff can promote literacy to more children and families and give them books to take home, keep and enjoy. **More than 200,000 appropriate gently used books for children ages birth to 10 are needed to distribute each year.** Used books should be gently used (covers and pages intact, clean and readable). Books with sensitive issues and/or illustrations (such as abuse, death, divorce, holidays, religion, violence and weapons) cannot be distributed at these Reach Out and Read sites.

DELIVERING BOOKS

- Reach Out and Read Greater Philadelphia staff can pick up large donations of children's books within 60 miles of West Philadelphia as long as: 1) she can give a brief presentation about the program to your group and thank them, and 2) if you can have someone on your end to please load your boxes into the colorful Reach Out and Read cargo van (you can take photos too). If you would like to pay for and mail your donation of books, please call 215-590-5989 to receive appropriate address. Reach Out and Read cannot pay for shipping/handling.
